Notes for dial-in users: *6 (star 6) to mute/unmute the audio from your phone to the meeting. This doesn't stop audio from the meeting to you.
*9 (star 9) raise your hand to (hopefully) let someone else at the meeting know you'd like to speak. You may use *9 again to lower your raised hand. Actual connection time may take several minutes; please be patient.

Once you are connected, your face (or phone number) should appear in a square on your screen, as will the faces of others who have signed in, including Pastor Salying, who will lead worship this morning. Note: For the sake of audio clarity, your mic will be muted on entry.

We will begin with introductory remarks, announcements, and then worship with Morning Prayer together as one large body. After the liturgy, all are invited to stay for a community gathering. You may print the order of service from this document, OR you may follow along when the order of service appears on the screen. When all are ready, the officiant will begin.

The Lessons

The First Lesson: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

Lector: A reading from the book of Proverbs.

Does not wisdom call. and does not understanding raise her voice? On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand; beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out: "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live. The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
