something new. And even where there is war and discord,


whether between countries, within families, or within our own hearts, God is present, gently leading us to new possibilities.


- You may stand or kneel at the altar rail, as you are able.

- Gluten free bread is available upon asking.







Campus Security There has been illicit, dangerous and disrespectful activity in our parking lot. This has become a problem for our staff and has raised neighbor complaints. The vestry has initiated installation of a bollard-and-chain set-up at our entrance driveways to deter these activities. 
