

At the conclusion of worship, we will celebrate the bishop's visit with a special lunch in Cowans Hall across the courtyard.





Advent Wreath Lighting



The Gospel: John 1:6-8,19-28

Gospeler: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ

according to John

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, "I am not the Messiah." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" He answered, "No." Then they said to him, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord," as the prophet Isaiah said. Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Bishop: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and

fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

Bishop: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever

you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good

News of God in Christ?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving

your neighbor as yourself?

People: I will, with God's help.

Bishop: Will you strive for justice and peace among all

people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: I will, with God's help.

Prayers for the Candidates

Bishop: Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their

commitment to Christ.

Leader: Deliver them O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

People: Lord hear our prayer.

Leader: Open their hearts to you grace and truth.

People: Lord hear our prayer.

Leader: Fill them with your holy and life-giving spirit.

The bishop, baptismal candidate and members of the altar party go to the font.

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Bishop blesses the water, first saying:

Bishop: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.**

Bishop: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Bishop: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.

Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words, the Bishop touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Baptism

Bishop: **Flora**, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

When this action has been completed, the Bishop, in full sight of the congregation, prays over the baptized: Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

The Bishop marks the forehead with chrism and the sign of the cross and saying:

Flora, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. Amen.

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

Bishop and People:

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The newly baptized is seated and members of the altar party return to the chancel.

Bishop: Let us now pray for these persons who have renewed their commitment to Christ.

Silence

Almighty God, we thank you that by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you have overcome sin and brought us to yourself, and that by the sealing of your Holy Spirit you have bound us to your service. Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at their Baptism. Send them forth in the power of that Spirit to perform the service you set before them; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A period of silence follows.

[Angela, Kris, Jeannie, Naveen], we recognize you as a member of the one holy catholic and apostolic Church, and we receive you into the fellowship of this Communion. God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you. **Amen.**

Bishop: Almighty and everlasting God, let your fatherly hand ever be over these your servants; let your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Word, that they may serve you in this life, and dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**






Everyone is invited to come to the altar railing during Communion.





Campus Security There has been illicit, dangerous and disrespectful activity in our parking lot. This has become a problem for our staff and has raised neighbor complaints. The vestry has initiated installation of a bollard-and-chain set-up at our entrance driveways to deter these activities. The chain will be secured by a padlock keyed to our campus keys so that any authorized keyholder will be able to unlock and lock up after access. Regularly scheduled events should continue without any impediment. In addition, street parking will always be available to anyone needing to make a quick stop on campus at a time when the parking lot is locked up (when no specific event has been scheduled). Installation is complete. Thank you for your patience as we work out any issues that may arise from this new procedure!
