Gospeler: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke



Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."







Please come to the rail.


- You may stand or kneel at the altar rail, as you are able.

- Gluten free bread is available upon asking.



Angels of the Bible: finding grace, beauty, and meaning by Kate Moorhead

Angels appear in the greatest of biblical moments: at the gates of the Garden of Eden, at the birth of Christ, and at the tomb of the resurrection. But modern-day Christians tend to either dismiss angels as fantasy or caricaturize them as one-dimensional cherubs. Episcopal priest Kate Moorehead invites us



into a more dynamic understanding of the realm of the angels. Scholar P. Scott Brown offers historical and theological context for these paintings of pivotal angelic appearances, including the Annunciation, the Celestial Hierarchy, and the Final Battle from Revelation.
